Curricular Innovations

Menlo 101 (Menlo College, First Year Experience)

Revamped the first-year experience seminar to include more community building activities and more focus on student wellness and sense of belonging. Also created a section especially for new transfer students.

Educ 359: Leading During Turbulent Times (Santa Clara University, Educational Leadership program) Developed the content for this graduate seminar that explores the critical role leaders play in maintaining the mission and vision of an organization and drive change during difficult times. With a focus on the impact of COVID-19 and remote learning, the course explored such topics as program development for transformative change, experiences across marginalizing structures and identities, moral and ethical decision making, the pandemic, the role of mentorship, and other related topics.

University Studies: Critical Strategies to Achieve Undergraduate Excellence (UCLA, Undergraduate Education)

Collaborated with the Director of Advising Professional Development to create a new section and curriculum that specifically addresses and affirms the first-generation college experience. Offered to first-year and transfer students.

Freshman Success: The First-Generation Experience (Loyola Marymount University, University Success)
Developed the First To Go Learning Community designed to bring together newly admitted first-generation college students to allow them to discover, experience, and transition to LMU life together. It seeks to provide a space for participants to engage one another in meaningful dialogue that is relevant to the individual and collective experiences of transitioning into college. Students are given the opportunity to take courses with their peers and with participation from faculty and staff who are also first generation.

The Black Student Experience at UCLA (UCLA, Undergraduate Education)

With a Resident Director and a faculty colleague, co-designed a one-unit seminar targeted at first-year students. The course encouraged discussion about social, academic, and political issues facing black students since Prop. 209. After several semesters, a student leader co-facilitated the course and developed the course assignments. This class inspired Blacklimated, a retention initiative launched through Project Lumina designed specifically for first year (freshmen and transfers) African American men at UCLA.

Graduate School Preparation (UCLA, Undergraduate Education)

With the support of a university grant and in collaboration with the Athletics Department, designed an intensive one-unit course that prepares low-income and first-generation students and alumni for graduate school. Offered only during Summer Sessions, this course currently averages 200 students per term.
